

and countless more.

Out of your great love, you sent One who was more than witness:
Jesus Christ, your only Son, our Savior.
Born of Mary, he lived among us,
sharing our joys and our sorrows,
even suffering the pains of death.

By your power at work in Christ,
he was raised from the dead
and is now seated at your right hand in the heavenly places,
above every name that is named,
not only in this age but also in the age to come.

Gracious God,
by the power of your Holy Spirit,
help us to set our hope on Christ
and live for the praise of his glory.

Pour out your Spirit upon us,
as you have poured out your Spirit
on generations past,

when we will feast with all the saints
