THE GATHERING OF THE COMMUNITY

PRAYER

God, you are our beginning and you will be our end; we are made in your image and likeness. **We praise and thank you for this day.** This is the day on which you created light and saw that it was good. This is the day in whose early morning light we discovered the tomb was empty, and encountered Christ, the world's true light. **This this is the day you have made; we shall rejoice and be glad in it.**

The Peace

Offertory Hymn

- We have a gospel to proclaim, Good news for all throughout the earth; the gospel of a Saviour's name: we sing his glory, tell his worth.
- Tell of his birth at Bethlehem, not in a royal house or hall, but in a stable dark and dim, the Word made flesh, a light for all.
- Tell of his death at Calvary, hated by those he came to save; in lonely suff'ring on the cross; for all he loved, his life he gave.

The Great Thanksgiving

Please remain standing or sitting throughout the Great Thanksgiving as is your custom

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed.

Lift up your hearts **We lift them up to God.**

Let us give thanks to God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Glorious God, we give you thanks and praise, for on this day creation sings, Christ is risen from the dead! He has burst forth from the tomb to break the tangles of despair and death. Love is come again.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with the eternal chorus of rejoicing who forever sing:

Holy, holy, holy, Lord, God of power, Giver of life, heaven and earth declare your splendour. Praise, glory, and love are yours.

All-embracing God, we give thanks for Jesus, the risen Lord of life, who rose victorious from the grave and made the whole creation new.

He broke bread with sinners, fed the hungry, and healed the oppressed, then he poured out his life in death that we might live in love. **Christ is risen from the dead. Love is come again.**

We thank you that on the night before he died for us our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, Take, eat: This is my body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said, Drink this all of you: This is my blood poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this to remember me. **Christ is risen from the dead. Love is come again.** Recalling his life, death, and glorious resurrection, we offer you these gifts of bread and wine, and our lives in thanks and praise.

Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be for us the body and blood of our Saviour Jesus Christ. Breathe your Spirit upon the whole earth, that we may proclaim good news to all the world and rise together as children of your new creation.

Then bring us to that new heaven here on earth, O God, where death and pain are no more and you dwell with us forever. Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, we worship you eternally in songs of pure unbounded praise. **Amen.**

As Christ teaches us we pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. We who are many are one body, for we all share the one bread.
